The third Run for Reading sponsored by the Friends of the St. Louis Public Library, slated for 6:15 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 19, offers participants exercise plus a bonus: a first-hand look at more than 30,000 books for sale.

The Run, a 5-kilometer event registered with the St. Louis Track Club and managed by professional race producers, will begin and end in front of Central Library, 1301 Olive.

Participants in Run for Reading will be admitted free of charge to the preview of the Library's first Book Sale, scheduled for the same evening. More than 30,000 books will be on sale, with the proceeds going to the Library's collections development budget. Admission to the preview for those not participating in the Run for Reading is \$5. Run registration is \$8 on or before Sept. 13 and \$10 after Sept. 13. To request a registration form, call 539-0343.

Participants will include employees of local companies running as corporate teams as well as other interested individuals. In addition to individual winners, prizes will also go to the largest participating corporate teams.

The preview for the Book Sale, the Library's first, is scheduled from 5 to 9 p.m. Sept 19 on the West Terrace of Central Library.

The Friends of the St. Louis Public Library is a non-profit organization whose mission is to promote and support the Library. Run for Reading has proved to be fun and effective way to draw community attention to the Library and its resources.

FOOD FOR FINES

The week of July 15-20, 1991, the Maplewood Public Library, located in Maplewood, MO, a suburb of St. Louis, held its second annual **Food For Fines** drive, during which the Library accepted donations of food instead of money from patrons returning overdue materials or paying existing fines. One-hundred, fifty-seven canned and boxed goods were received during the food drive. The food was displayed in the Library, and later delivered to the Maple Heights Service organization, a local food pantry.

The first Food For Fines drive by the Library was held last December. Library Director, Terrence Donnelly, reported that this food drive was well-received by the community. "People are aware that hunger is a year-round problem," he said, noting that many of those donating food had no overdue items, but simply came to the library to drop off a donation. In addition, borrowers returned over 300 overdue books, some overdue almost a year.

In an interesting sidelight, <u>USA Today</u> picked up the report on the Library's Food For Fines drive and included it in its <u>Across</u> the <u>USA</u> section on July 15, 1991, probably the first time the Maplewood Public Library has received national exposure.

WHICH CD-ROM?

St. Louis Public Library is the recipient of a LSCA grant from the Missouri State Library to test CD-ROM products. Various CD-ROMs will be requested from publishers and vendors for a 30 to 60 day trial period and tested in a public service area of the Central Library. Two survey forms, one for library patrons and one for librarians/library staff, will be available next to the computer for completion by those who use the cdroms. The results of the surveys will be compiled and distributed to public libraries in Missouri.

Subject areas the library is considering for initial testing include encyclopedias, phone books, and various business sources on CD-ROM. 
