## WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY LIBRARIES CELEBRATE DRAMATIC EXPANSION OF THE ONLINE SYSTEM

LUIS PLUS is a significantly enhanced system that includes the online catalog, journal indexes, and government publications. The LUIS PLUS system represents a jump from 325,000 available records to more than 2 million, with continued growth of approximately 50,000 records per month, representing both the growth of journal article indexes and the completion of retrospective conversion of the online catalog. Work on using LUIS PLUS as a gateway to resources external to the Washington University library system is underway.
